6	(a) Evaluation.—The Director, in consultation
7	with the head of the Made in America Office, shall evalu-
8	ate the procurement activities of each agency to determine
9	whether the provisions of section 15.101-2 of the Federal
10	Acquisition Regulation have—
11	(1) impacted the ability of the head of any
12	agency to procure products made in the United
13	States; or
14	(2) created any national security risk.
15	(b) EVALUATION.—Not later than 180 days after the
16	enactment of this Act, the Director shall submit a report
17	on the results of the evaluation under subsection (a) to—
18	(1) the Committee on Oversight and Account-
19	ability of the House of Representatives; and
20	(2) the Committee on Homeland Security and
21	Governmental Affairs of the Senate.

23	(1) Agency.—The term "agency" has the

4	(3) Product made in the united states.—
5	The term "product made in the United States"
6	means, with respect to a product—
7	(A) all, or virtually all, of the product was
8	made in the United States; and
9	(B) all significant parts, processing, and
10	labor that go into the product are of United
11	States origin.
